HOLY SACRAMENTS

(Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion, Confirmation, Marriage/Holy Matrimony, Holy Orders & Anointing of the Sick)

People who wish to receive any of the Holy Sacraments must be a REGISTERED PARISHIONER of St. Mary's Parish: Brooks + Tide Lake Mission.

For Baptisms, all requirements must be completed before booking a Baptism date. At least TWO MONTHS NOTICE must be given in order to complete all the requirements.


For Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation, all requirements, including classes/sessions MUST BE COMPLETED to be eligible for Sacraments.

For Marriages, all requirements must be completed before booking a Marriage date. At least SIX MONTHS NOTICE must be given in order to ensure the proper paperwork can be finalized and guaranteed. There will be no exceptions.

Lent is a 40-day period of prayer, fasting and almsgiving that starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Thursday. It's a time of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

We seek Him by reading His Word; we help others through giving alms; and we practice self-control by fasting. Abstinence from luxuries is important, but true inner conversion of heart is key for faithfully following Christ's will during this sacred season of preparation. In the Lenten season, we remember our baptism when we were born again into a new life in Christ, and died to sin and evil.


FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are universal days of fasting and abstinence from meat. Anyone over the age of 18 and under the age of 59 are obliged to fast and abstain.

Fasting, in the Latin Church, is the limitation of food and drink - typically to one main meal and two smaller meals (that together do not equal the regular meal in size), with no solid foods in between.

Abstinence is the refraining from certain kinds of food or drink, typically meat. While all Fridays are days of abstinence from meat, in Canada "Catholics may substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day." - Ordo, note 29b and 29d.





St. Mary's Parish is in a good financial position as of 2023 Year-end. Revenue have been trending up despite the increasing cost of operation.

CONCLUSION (cont'd)

Expenditures have started to go down since 2022, as a result of the Pastoral Initiative to reduce unnecessary operational costs, active parishioner relationship and involvement, and increasing parish operational and pastoral efficiency.

Despite the COVID19 Pandemic (2020-2022) which caused a significant strain in our lives, our parish and our community; St. Mary's Parish and its' Parishioners stood up the test of time and become ever more resilient.

As the result of the efforts of our Parish Priest, Rev. Fr. Marino Infante, the Parish Staff and the various Parish Ministries and Organizations, despite many challenges after the pandemic; the beating heart of our Parish life and our community, the Holy Eucharist, became ever more present and more prominent as shown by the increase of people receiving the Holy Sacraments (Baptisms, First Reconciliations, First Communions, Confirmations, Marriages & Anointings of the Sick) and entering RCIA + RCIC, increase in pastoral programs due to parishioners taking in leadership, highly active parish to parishioner relationship which resulted in increased registrations and increased donors who provided the needs of the Parish; and the increased outreach of the Parish, through its various ministries, organizations and Catholic Schools, serving the pastoral needs of the whole community.

Parish Renewal Teams: Blessed Beginnings

What an exciting time for us in the Diocese! Over 44 parishes sent their Parish Renewal Team members to an orientation which took place simultaneously on Saturday, Feb. 10, 2024, at St. Luke's and St. Albert the Great's in Calgary, St. Martha's in Lethbridge and Holy Family Parish at Medicine Hat. Close to 300 parish renewal team members joined in the orientation day, which was filled with lively conversation and learning opportunities.



Then we heard the testimonies of three fellow parishioners who shared their personal experiences. Sarah Stamp from Vauxhall, AB spearheaded the testimonies, focusing on the primary goal of Pastoral Renewal: Strengthening Family Life. Lorand Szojka from St. Peter's Parish in Calgary spoke about Forming Missionary Disciples in Christ. Lastly, Liisa Honish, a parishioner from St. Albert the Great's Parish shared her experiences on being a Church of Encounter and Witness.

The speakers emphasized the significance of personal connections

and mutual care, rather than relying solely on programs. They highlighted the profound and lasting impact of simple acts performed with love within parish communities and families. Furthermore, they provided insights on integrating faith into daily life, embracing our roles within families, and fostering welcoming parish environments.



One member found the testimonies inspiring, stating, "There are people out there already living it. That means it's possible!" Bonnie added, "Participants were really inspired by the testimonies of Sarah, Lorand, and Liisa and relished the opportunity to discuss renewal ideas in their small groups. They left feeling enthusiastic and encouraged by their colleagues and peers, and most especially by the leadership and support provided by the Diocesan Leadership Team."

Following the group discussion, the sites were filled with a contagious enthusiasm. After getting an overview of what the next several months will look like for the teams, they were sent out with a prayerful commissioning by the Bishop.

The pilgrimage has begun and we are greatly comforted knowing we walk together. We left with these encouraging words ringing in our hearts: We can make renewal happen! Here's to a future filled with love, growth, and renewal!





If You Feed Them, They Will Come

After a successful launch of Alpha at the parish as part of our community's response to the synodal process, it was a natural progression to bring Alpha Youth to the students at St. Joseph's Collegiate (SJC). SJC is a grade 9-12 Catholic school in Brooks, with about 460 students. We cater to a diverse community, with a wide range of cultural and language backgrounds, as well as varying practices of faith - most students non-practicing, nominally and some practicing Catholics, some ethnic orthodox denominations, as well as a growing number from other Christian church communities.

Just before the start of the school year, we committed to running the Alpha Youth series in our school during our 42 minute lunch break. Four staff were recruited to facilitate groups, the supervision schedule was adjusted to free us all up at the same time, and we started online training and promoting. Overall, we have had a consistent 24 students who have made most if not all of the sessions, and probably had another dozen or so who checked it out a couple of times at the start.

Feedback consistently sounds like: "I love my group, so my favourite part is discussing ideas, expressing my thoughts, and listening to other's opinions." Or, my favourite part is "the connection and community." Reassuringly we even gotten, "the food is great, but I also enjoy hearing other people's perspective on the questions." They are excited to keep the conversations going to continue to explore and deepen their own faith, and to share it with their peers.

I Overcome Your Difficulties


Meditation:




